- 5. Restland Cemetery – American Flag Concrete Bases**
  - a. Council discussion on assisting the Baxter Legion with the installation of new concrete bases for the 15 American flags at Restland Cemetery. Discussion may include the scope of work, cost-sharing, materials, and timeline. Council may take action based on the discussion.
- 6. Resolution 2025-49 – Approval of West Avenue Phase II Construction Administration Agreement**
  - a. Council discussion and possible action to approve Resolution 2025-49, a resolution authorizing the City of Baxter to enter into a professional services agreement with MSA Professional Services for construction administration and observation of the South West Avenue Reconstruction Phase II project, from Hwy F17 to W. Watson Street. The agreement includes project oversight, weekly progress meetings, staking, part-time construction observation, submittal reviews, and post-construction services at an estimated fee of \$30,000.
- 7. Public Hearing on proposal to enter into a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement**
  - a. The City Council will hold a public hearing on the proposal to enter into a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement in a principal amount not to exceed \$750,000, for the purpose of paying the costs of road, water, and stormwater infrastructure improvements. Members of the public may comment in person at the hearing or submit written comments to City Hall prior to the meeting. Following the hearing, the Council may take action on the final resolution authorizing the loan agreement and issuance of bonds.
- 8. Resolution 2025-50 - Taking additional action on proposal to enter into a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement**

- a. Council discussion and possible action to approve Resolution 2025-50, a resolution taking additional action on the proposal to enter into a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement in a principal amount not to exceed \$750,000. This follows the public hearing held on August 11, 2025, and authorizes the City to proceed with issuing General Obligation Bonds to finance eligible infrastructure improvements.

#### **9. City Ordinance Review – Codifier Questions**

- a. Council discussion on the review of outstanding questions submitted by the City's codifier during the municipal code update process. Staff will present specific items requiring clarification or policy direction from the Council to ensure accurate and consistent codification of Baxter's ordinances. Council may provide guidance or request follow-up on any ordinances needing revision or confirmation.

#### **10. Discussion on Community Center Rental Rates**

- a. Council discussion on current Community Center rental rates, including full-day and commercial rental options with and without alcohol. Council may consider whether adjustments to rental fees or deposit amounts are warranted based on facility usage, operating costs, or comparable rates in surrounding communities. No formal action will be taken unless directed for a future meeting.

#### **11. Authorization of City Match for Comprehensive Plan Grant**

- a. Council discussion and possible action to authorize the City Administrator to remit a local match in the amount of \$2,977.44 toward the total cost of the \$23,000 Comprehensive Plan update. The city match is required to access \$20,022.56 in grant funding, which has been awarded in support of the project. Payment of the local match will ensure full eligibility for the grant and allow the comprehensive planning process to move forward.

#### **12. Public Comments -** At this time, citizens may address the Council. Except in cases of legal emergency, the City Council cannot take formal action at the meeting but may ask the City staff to research the matter or have the matter placed on a subsequent Agenda.

**To be heard, a citizen must be recognized by the chair and state their name and address.** Speakers will be given three minutes to present their concerns. Comments and/or questions must be related to City policies or the provision of City services and shall not include derogatory comments about other individuals. Unless specifically called upon by the Mayor, no additional comments and/or questions will be addressed during the remaining meeting once the Public Comment portion has been closed.
